





Program Notes Allen Community Band

The Lion King - Broadway Selections - Now in it's 20th year, The Lion King is the third longest-running show in Broadway history and the highest grossing Broadway production of all time. Arranger Jay Bocook creates an exciting medley of songs from this Tony Award winning musical, including: Circle of Life, I Just Can't Wait to be King. Can You Feel the Love Tonight, Hakuna Matata, They Live in You, and King of Pride Rock.

The Stars and Stripes Forever – A patriotic American march widely considered to be the magnum opus of composer John Philip Sousa. Sousa composed this march out of homesickness while travelling back to America from Europe. After seeing the vast difference between America and other countries, he stated: "...and that flag of ours became glorified...and to my imagination it seemed to be the biggest, grandest, flag in the world, and I could not get back under it quick enough." Sousa composed the march in his head and committed the notes to paper after he arrived in the United States. "The Stars and Stripes Forever" found its place in history, becoming the most popular march ever written. By a 1987 act of the U.S. Congress, it is the official National March of the United States of America.

Program Notes *Allen Community Band*

The Star-Spangled Banner – Written by Francis Scott Key, an attorney and gifted amateur poet, while watching the British bombard Fort McHenry in Baltimore Harbor during the War of 1812. This is the first concert-sized publication of the superb Sousa-Damrosch *The Star-Spangled Banner*, and remains one of the most standard and sing-able arrangements of the United States National Anthem. It was harmonized in 1917 by Walter Damrosch and skillfully arranged by John Philip Sousa.

American Celebration – Robert W. Smith is one of the most popular and prolific composers in America today with over 600 publications in print. He is currently teaching in the Music Industry program at Troy University in Troy, Alabama. His teaching responsibilities include music composition, production, publishing and business. His setting of *American Celebration* is based on George M. Cohan's *You're a Grand Old Flag* and *Yankee Doodle*.

The Washington Post – In 1889, the owners of <u>The Washington Post</u> newspaper requested that John Philip Sousa compose a march for the newspaper's essay contest awards ceremony. Sousa obliged; *The Washington Post* march was introduced at the ceremony on June 15, 1889. It became very popular and led to a British journalist dubbing Sousa "The March King". Sousa is honored in <u>The Washington Post</u> building for his contribution to the newspaper and his country. *The Washington Post* has remained one of his most popular marches throughout the United States and many other countries.

The Hounds of Spring – "When the hounds of spring are on winter's traces," a magical picture of young love in springtime, forms the basis for this musical setting. Inspired by the poem Atlanta in Calydon by Algernon Swinburne, Alfred Reed composed *The Hounds of Spring* as a lovely song of joy...an attempt to capture the elements of the poem, exuberant youthful gaiety and the sweetness of tender love.

Sea Songs – Composed by Ralph Vaughan Williams, *Sea Songs* is an arrangement of three British sea-songs; *Princess Royal*, *Admiral Benbow*, and *Portsmouth*. Originally this setting of folk songs was the fourth movement of Vaughan Williams' well-known *English Folk Song Suite*, but after the first performance he removed it and decided to publish it separately.

English Folk Song Suite – Written in 1923, English Folk Song Suite is one of composer Ralph Vaughan Williams's most famous works for military band. The suite consists of three movements, each containing a collection of folk songs. The first movement is titled March – "Seventeen Come Sunday", and includes: Seventeen Come Sunday, Pretty Caroline, and Dives and Lazarus. The second movements is titled Intermezzo – "My Bonny Boy", and includes: My Bonny Boy and Green Bushes. The third movement is titled March – "Folk Songs from Somerset", and includes: Blow Away the Morning Dew, High Germany, The Tree So High, and John Barleycorn.
